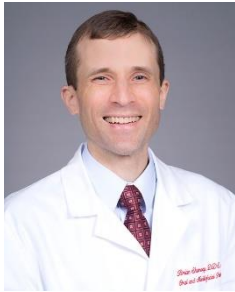

What Is That White Lesion?

Professor, Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology in the Department of Diagnosis & Oral Health; Associate Dean for Graduate Education & Faculty Development, University of Louisville School of Dentistry

In this presentation, attendees will learn five mechanisms that cause oral tissues to look white and the associated causes. Attendees will also improve diagnostic skills of white oral lesions through group-based discussion.

Brian Shumway, DDS, MS is a professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology at the University of Louisville, School of Dentistry. He received his dental degree from The Ohio State University in 2003, followed by one year of advanced education in general dentistry at the Veteran's Affairs Audie L. Murphy Memorial Hospital in San Antonio, TX. He then completed a residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and master's degree at The Ohio State University. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and a Fellow of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. He teaches in the predoctoral dental and all specialty dental residency programs. He has an active clinical practice specializing in diagnosis and management of oral diseases and participates in the University of Louisville oral pathology biopsy service.

An overview and guide to implementing the 2017 AAP periodontal classification system as well as a review of current scientific literature which may change the way periodontology is viewed and classified in the future.
